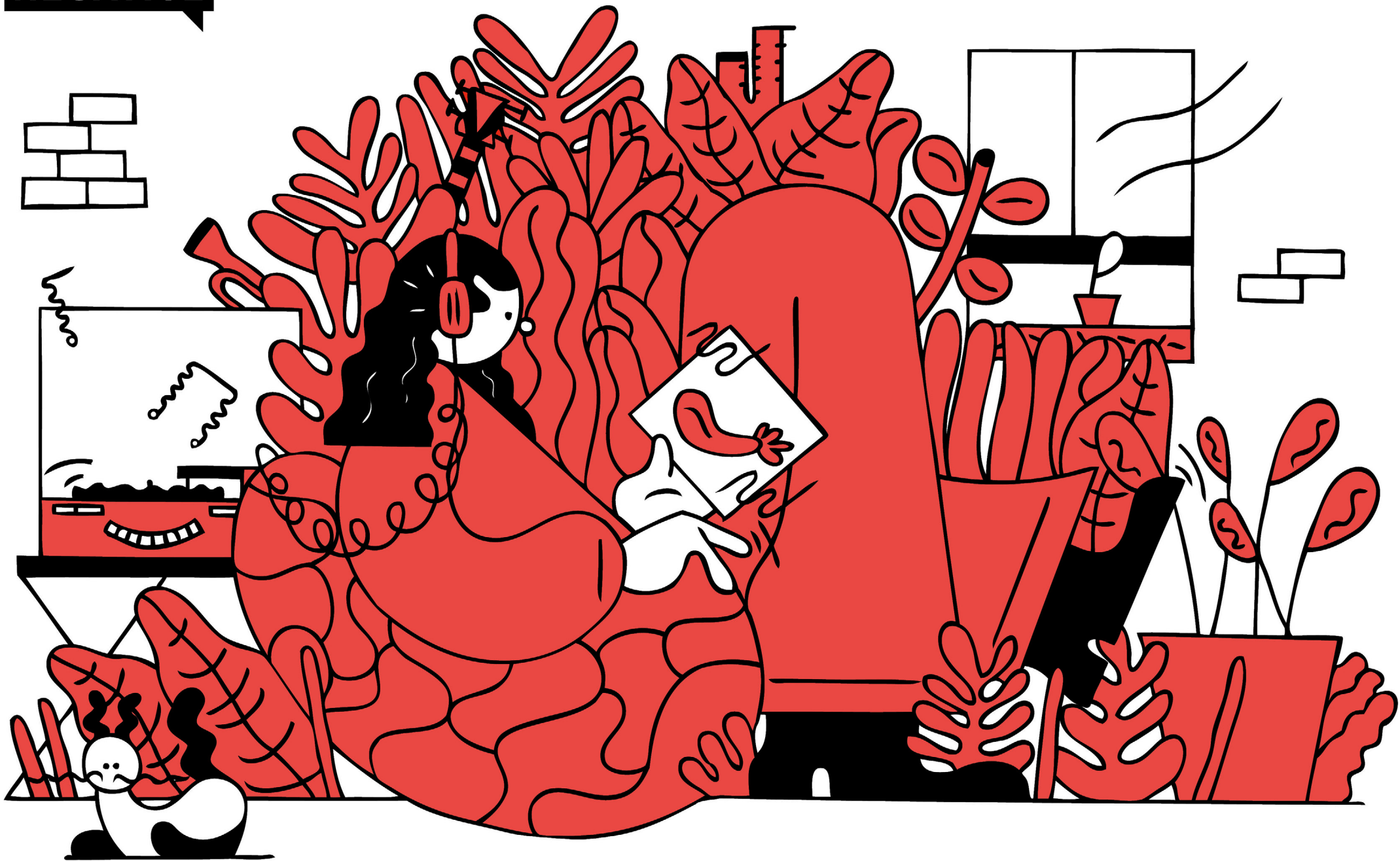

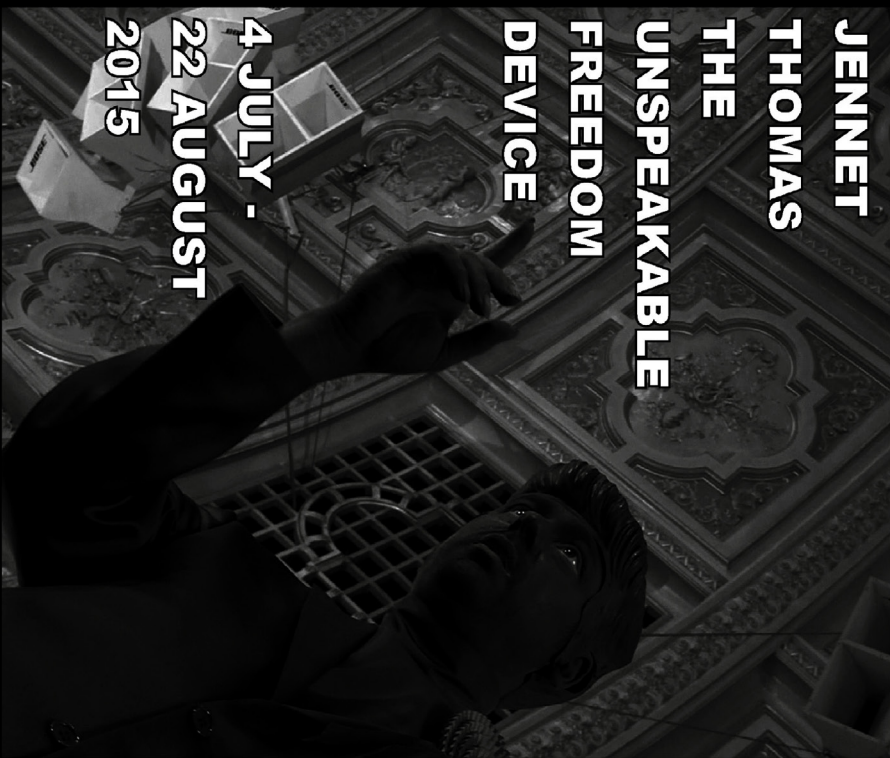

WALK THE CITY

Liverpool is a compact city, jam-packed full of arts, design, film and music. There's lots to see and do, yet you can reach everything on foot from Lime Street Station within about 20 minutes. Here's our guide to the highlights.

5 MINUTES FROM LIME ST

Head straight out of Lime Street and within minutes, you can be admiring some of Britain's finest civic buildings along William Brown Street. You can't miss St Georges Hall – "the most perfect hall in the world" according to Charles Dickens. A neo-classical masterpiece, it's the perfect place to see concerts and theatre. Then there's the Walker Art Gallery,

which houses an outstanding collection of paintings, sculpture and decorative art from the 13th century to the present day. Check out the superb John Moores Painting Prize collection – including past winners David Hockney and Peter Doig.

10 MINUTES

Within a 10 minute walk from Lime Street, the city changes considerably. Head up Bold Street and find a huge variety of places to eat, drink and be merry. At LEAF Tea Shop – 'One of the Top Five Places in the UK for Brunch' (The Times) – good sharing platters, drawing classes and gigs are always on the menu. Over the road at FACT, you'll find cutting-edge exhibitions centred around new technology, plus the latest art house and foreign language films. Round the corner, The Kazimier (and adjoining Gardens) is open all year round: a truly unique, hand-crafted art space offering the best touring musicians and experimental and immersive performance.

15 MINUTES

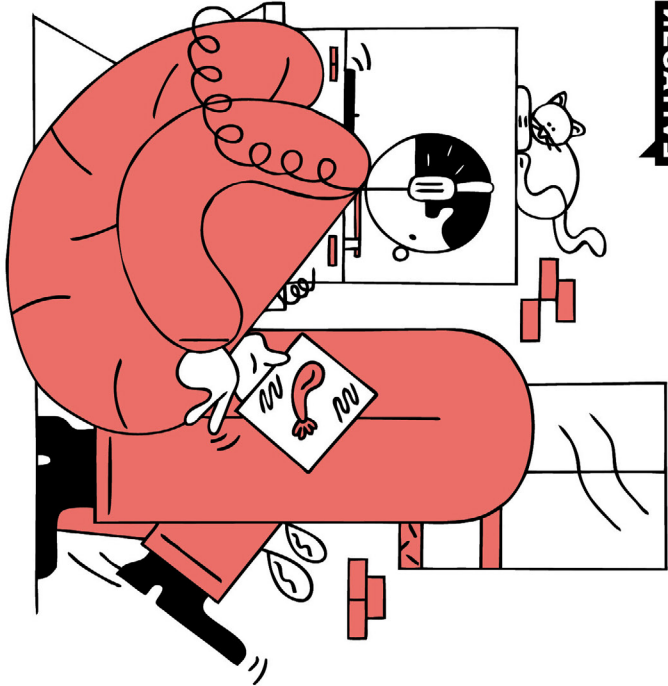
Stroll up Brownlow Hill and in 15 minutes you'll find the Exhibition Research Centre (ERC) nestled within the Liverpool School of Art and Design – the first

academic centre devoted to the study of exhibitions in the UK. Quietly producing confident shows since 2013, the arts space is open to the public, but as yet flying somewhat under the radar. Over the road is the University of Liverpool's glorious Grade II-listed Victoria Gallery & Museum, designed by architect Alfred Waterhouse (also known for the Natural History Museum, London). Renovated to celebrate Liverpool's year as European Capital of Culture (2008), expect taxidermy, fossils and new exhibitions of contemporary art.

20 MINUTES

A 20 minute walk from Lime Street and the River Mersey is revealed. A UNESCO World Heritage site, it's not surprising that the Albert Dock is one of the most popular destinations for tourists and locals alike. Here you'll find Tate Liverpool in a converted warehouse; one of the UK's most significant galleries, expect Picassos, Warhols and Turner Prize winners. Just around the corner is Open Eye, the only gallery in the North-West dedicated to photography. A hidden gem, expect boundary-pushing artists showcased through temporary shows and archives.
